ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW:

Glen Canyon Outdoor Academy (GCOA) is an accredited Charter School serving the community of Page, Arizona and surrounding Navajo Nation Reservation communities. Page has a population of nearly 8,000 and is the largest town within a 130 mile radius. A benefit of being located in the center of the Grand Circle atop the majestic Colorado Plateau, Page is surrounded by stunning geology and tribal and public lands. The development of GCOA came from citizens of Page seeking to utilize the amazing natural resources that surround our area, capitalize on the rich culture of our people, and from the desire to offer a unique and engaging learning model to our students.

POSITION SUMMARY:

The GCOA specials teacher supports the development of students in all arts related studies. Topics could include but are not limited to: physical education, art, music, Navajo culture, languages, etc. The specials teacher develops and delivers instruction for 6 week unit increments. The specials teacher will also be responsible for: the supervision of students within the classroom, school approved educational settings and other assigned areas, the development of lesson plans, collaboration with teachers and GCOA staff, student management and communication with staff, families, and the GCOA community.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

The Specials Teacher's key responsibilities include the following areas and may be changed at any time based on the needs of GCOA:

- Accurately demonstrate knowledge of the assigned content area.
- Develops and delivers instruction that supports the GCOA vision and mission.
- Plans for whole group, small group and individual student instruction based on the learning needs of the students.
- Assesses student progress towards determined targets for the purpose of providing feedback to students, parents and administration.
- Collaborates with staff, parents, and community for the purpose of improving the quality of student outcomes.
- Directs the use of paraprofessionals and volunteers for the purpose of delivering an effective classroom program.
- Manages student behavior using the GCOA Behavior Management Plan.
- Monitors students in a variety of educational environments including classroom, cafeteria, grounds, hallways, off campus learning opportunities and field trips, for the purpose of providing a safe and positive learning environment.
- Participates in meetings and professional development activities to promote individual growth and for the purpose of enhancing the GCOA educational plan.
- Reports incidents for the purpose of maintaining the safety of students and supporting a positive school learning environment including those that adhere to state law and board policies.
- Participates in safety related training and potentially provides first aid to students when engaged in GCOA activities.
- Other duties as they may be assigned to meet the safety and well-being of students and which may benefit the GCOA educational program.

The Ideal Candidate Will Have:

- Strong and demonstrated commitment to the school's mission and core model
- Passion for the outdoors and at minimum an understanding of basic outdoor-related skills.
- Personal ownership for school success and student growth.
- Belief that ALL children can learn and succeed.
- Ability to problem solve and deal with a variety of situations that may arise.
- Ability to work effectively with students, staff, parents, and community from diverse backgrounds and begin responsive to their needs.
- Demonstrate ability to motivate students to work to achieve high expectations.
- Proven effective classroom instruction and classroom management skills.
- Exceptional interpersonal and communication skills to effectively relate and communicate with all GCOA stakeholder groups.
- Passion for teaching and building relationships with students from all educational and economic backgrounds.
- Willingness to "go above and beyond" to support students in achieving academic, behavior and social emotional goals.
- Commitment to continued personal and professional growth, including opportunities pursued individually and provided through GCOA.
- Positive attitude towards being a part of a school team and displays a strong sense of professionalism skills.

- Management and organizational ability, displaying common sense, and a positive attitude.
- Compliance with all GCOA policies and rules as well as the legal requirements of the State of Arizona.
- Computer skills proficient to address classroom requirements and GCOA educational program needs.
